
THE ROLE OF THE CORONER'S OFFICE

The primary function of the Coroner's Office is to investigate all deaths which occur as a result of violence or injury, those deaths which occur under unusual or suspicious circumstances and deaths of individuals who die suddenly when in apparently good health. The duties of the Coroner are provided by Ohio Statute (ORC 313), which grant the authority to conduct investigations into those deaths which, in the Coroner's opinion, occur under any of the above conditions. We serve a population of more than 825,000 residents.

MISSION STATEMENT

The mission of the Hamilton County Coroner's Office is to serve the public by providing accurate, thorough and efficient medico legal investigations of death, thereby ensuring justice, and providing solace, comfort and protection to the living.
